



er came from Towcester and watched all four sessions too.

Attached is the inside out ornament I made. It's about 150mm (6") long, with acrylic colour on the inside. The glue-up was rather last minute so when I eventually parted the piece from the spigot in the chuck it started to separate again. There

had been a noise when I pushed the tail-end ring centre in, so that was presumably the joints failing!!

Also attached is a photo of a salt and pepper set. They started out as simple tree ornaments, so not made as a pair, but I had a couple of caps from the bud vase inserts that Mick used to sell in the club shop, and thought it a novel way to put them to good use. These stand just short of 90mm tall, were drilled with a 15mm Forstner bit. The salt shaker has a 4mm hole and the pepper one 5 x 2.5mm holes. The inner edges of the four outer holes align with the mark made by my ring centre, thus the outsides are on the edge of the 15mm bore. They have been finished by multiple dunking in food safe oil.■
