#### Who was Eliza Somerville Broadus?

She was born in Charlottesville, Virginia in 1851. In 1877, after moving with her family to Louisville, Kentucky, Miss Broadus joined Walnut Street Baptist Church and became a member of the missionary society of that church. The following year, 1878, Kentucky formed a Central Committee and Miss Broadus was elected to serve on that committee as the representative from the Walnut Street society. She continued to serve as an active member of Kentucky's Central Committee, later known as the Executive Committee, until 1928, a period of fifty years. During that time she was chairman of the committee for thirty-two years and vice-chairman for nine years. When she resigned from the committee in 1928 she was made an honorary life member of the committee. In 1888, when Woman's Missionary Union was organized in Richmond, Virginia, Miss Broadus was not present, but was nevertheless elected vice-president from Kentucky. She made valuable contributions to WMU work through her years of service both in Kentucky and in the work of national WMU.

# CHRIST TRAINING

It's Back to School Time! And as unusual as this year has been and continues to be, it's time to return to some sense of normalcy for our students. While most of them will be starting the year at home virtually, it is still school and all that comes along with it. While the year ended is a strange way, and now it's beginning in a strange way, I hope you will join me in prayer for our teachers, students and families. Pray for a great and smooth beginning to this year, and that they would make the most of the opportunity that is before them.

Students, while it may seem like it was yesterday when the last school bell rang and school was abruptly halted, it's time to begin the new year. Time to trade your suitcases full of swimsuits and sunglasses for a backpack full of books. The sun's been out, and the weather has been hot, even if it was for a short while. Summertime has come and gone. Now we've reached the time of year where it starts getting darker earlier, the leaves start changing colors and the heat turns into cool, crisp air. This all means one thing: school is back in session. While the year will look quite different, the things you will face as students still are present. Message to the parents: It's impossible to know everything that goes on while your child is at school or online. But the best thing you can do is give them a daily reminder of the Lord they serve. Pray with your children each morning before school. Read scriptures with them

Message to the congregation: It is not just the parent's responsibility to raise these children in the "training and admonition of the Lord" (Eph. 6:4). As a flock of God's people, we are to look after each other. We are to all set an example in "word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (1 Tim. 4:12). Let us all take the responsibility to make sure that everyone continues to grow spiritually. It takes a village to raise a child. Whether you want to admit it or not, every child in this congregation is your own. Remember what it was like to be young? Do whatever you can to help these students succeed.

2020 will be a year that will be hard to erase from our memory. Hopefully the issues we have faced and problems we have had will soon be in our past. As the new school year starts, it can be a time of change, excitement and new adventure. I pray you start strong, stay strong and finish strong as you try to be the best student and person you can be.
