

From your Pastor's heart...

When you think of a *miracle*, what do you usually think of? Does the word bring to mind something that is supernatural in origin, or does it remind you simply of something that is amazing in how it came about, and how it impacted the lives of everybody that was involved?

I found the following descriptions of what a *miracle* is - a surprising and welcome event that cannot be explained by natural or scientific laws and is therefore considered to be the work of God; a highly improbable or extraordinary event, or accomplishment that brings verv welcome consequences.

When Moses came before Pharaoh in efforts to gain the release of the

children of Israel from Egyptian bondage, he performed number of *miracles*, from changing his rod into a serpent, turning the Nile River into blood, to the other 9 plagues. They were a gift from Jehovah God as visible confirmation that he was a man of God sent to deliver the people of God from bondage.

The first *miracle* that Jesus performed was at His mother's request at the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee where He turned water into wine. He calmed storms, walked on the water, healed sickness and diseases, cleansed lepers, cast out demons, fed 5,000

> people on a hillside with 5 loaves of bread and two small fish, and raised the dead. His power to perform *miracles* even caught Herod's attention. Luke says that when Herod saw Jesus, he was glad because he had desired for a long time to see Him, for he had heard many things about Him, and hoped to see some miracle done by Him.

> When it comes to circumstances in our day, we are asking for nothing short of a true *miracle*. We aren't pitching a tent and planning a

miracle crusade. We aren't raising up an individual to exalt as a miracle working preacher. And we aren't even asking for the faith to believe in something bigger than life to come before our eyes. But what we are asking for is for God to *miraculously* intervene in circumstances, in the midst of this COVID-19 Pandemic, and to heal the sick and deliver our world from a bondage like none any of us have ever experienced before.
