

Perspectives

From your Pastor's heart...

Most people have heard about the ten plagues with which God struck Egypt to break Pharaoh's will and cause him to release the Israelites from their enslavement. Far less known are the ten times the released Israelites put God to the test in the days following their exodus. But God certainly knew about them.

I came across a phrase the other day in Numbers 14:22 where God said that "all these men who have seen My glory and the signs which I did in Egypt and in the wilderness, have put Me to the test now these ten times." That reference to "testing God ten times" was to God's peoples' complaints - (1) at the Red Sea, (2) at

Marah, (3) in the wilderness of Sin, (4) at Rephidim, (5) at Horeb, (6) at Taberah, (7) at the graves of lust, (8) at Kibrothhattaavah, and 9-10 there in Numbers 14 specifically against Moses and Aaron.

I've talked to a lot of people over the course of this past year, some overwhelmed by the weight of the burden of the pandemic, and the fear that they would not survive. Many of them spoke words that probably resembled the words that God's people spoke in their wilderness of despair. They were serious words. They were honest words. But they were words void of hope and gratitude. They were complaints. Did they have a right to complain? Sure, they did. But did they have a reason to praise God and keep believing? By all means.

We find ourselves in a season that may well be characterized by hope. Vaccines are being dispensed at

> this very moment. Things seem to be moving in a direction toward normality (even though normal may be different). You may ask, "do we have a right to complain?" Sure, we do. But please also ask, "do we have a reason to praise

God and keep believing?" By all means.

We have two choices in how to respond: we can choose to see only the bad and complain, or we can choose to see God at work and contribute. By contribute, I mean to

look for ways to get involved and to make a difference. I have been praying that we will be known by how we get involved in people's lives and make a difference. Will you join me? Will you pray?
