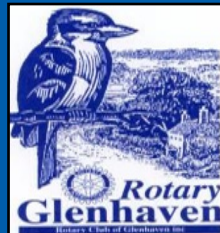

I am not going to speak for long as next month the board will be presenting our club plan. However I would like to briefly touch on three community projects.

1. Mental Health and domestic violence is a real issue for many young people at this present time. Domestic Violence does occur in the hills area, and I am in contact with The Lisa Harnum Foundation to see what assistance we can offer.
2. Warrah School – children with special needs. We have assisted them on several occasions during the year with BBQ's and anniversary celebrations. We have applied for a district grant to purchase much needed equipment for a planned extension at the school.
3. PCYC – Recently a group of Rotarians and partners went on a road trip and visited PCYC at Dubbo and Walgett. Walgett is to commence building a badly needed brand new facility and we have asked the coordinator to send the club ideas of how we can offer assistance. Dom Teakle CEO of PCYC is a member of our club so we shall be working closely with him on this project.

Internationally we shall continue to connect with the Rotary clubs of Ilawarra Sunrise and Seaford (in the UK) and visit the Philippines for the annual dental and medical mission.

Membership is very much on the agenda this year, we are an aging club and our membership is declining. I have great faith in PDG Barry Philps and his team of 5 to go about their business and invite new members to join. It is possible that we may well loose another couple of members during this Rotary Year who will be moving away from the area. For our club to be viable we need new members. At present we have a membership of 33, so we must have a net gain by the end of the year. CAN WE DO IT.....YES WE CAN..... and at the end of the year I hope to say

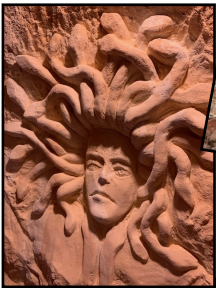
