

Dear President & Members,

The Rotary Club of Eltham sincerely thanks you for your donation of \$1,000 to the Aquabox project. Aquabox plays a vital role in minimising the aftereffects of disaster when the lack of, or disruption to, safe water supply and sanitation creates a breeding ground for waterborne disease including cholera and typhoid.

Since 2001, Aquabox has been a major project of our club. Each Aquabox '30' has a 75 litre capacity and sufficient filter/purification sets to provide 30,000 litres of clean water. The Aquabox 'Family' provides 2,000 litres of drinkable water, which is sufficient for a family of four for more than six months, together with humanitarian aid items. The need for clean water continues to be an absolute priority and thus the imperative of ensuring that Aquaboxes reach stricken areas promptly. They are then monitored and distributed by recipient aid agencies.

Aquabox has helped to prevent and to fight disease in many countries including East Timor, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, the Philippines, Samoa, Haiti, Pakistan, Cambodia, Solomon Islands, Papua New Guinea, Vanuatu, Nepal and India. We need to stay focused on working to alleviate suffering wherever possible.

An initiative has been launched to strengthen relationships with Rotary clubs and other NGOs in key regions, to ensure that Aquaboxes can be pre-positioned and therefore readily available in the event of a disaster. As a result, 51 of 120 'Family' boxes that arrived in Cambodia in January were recently able to be rapidly deployed by the Rotary Club of Phnom Penh to aid families made homeless as a result of a serious fire.

Your assistance and support is deeply appreciated as it assists in ensuring the viability of Aquabox and our ability to respond rapidly to regions in crisis.
