"Help make more low-barrier, entry-level, temporary shelter available to more persons experiencing, or about to experience, a loss of housing;

- 1. Provide for more longer-term transitional shelters with onsite supportive services;
- 2. Allow construction of a wider variety of more affordable types of permanent housing, particularly forms of group / shared housing.
- 3. Allow accommodations sited as temporary emergency uses to be reviewed and considered for approval through permanent code provisions."

We are facing concurrent crises, from looming evictions to increasing homelessness. Now more than ever, we need to get this code change right.

We are asking the PSC to:

- **Extend** the housing emergency and take more time to improve this code change. Preserve City Council's current authority to declare a housing emergency.
- Allow Outdoor Shelters in Open Space zones and in right-of-way.
- Increase the number of beds allowed in short term shelters by right to 40 beds in RM1, RMP and IR zones.
- Allow Group Living by right in existing residential structures of any size. In low-density zones, increase the number of sleeping rooms allowed without triggering the Group Living category.
- Not count occupied RVs against the number of ADUs allowed on a site.
- Relax conditional-use review requirements for shelters.
- Allow accommodation types in Outdoor Shelters to include RVs, Tiny Houses on Wheels, and other types of shelter/housing.
