The Parish Council continues to meet "virtually" via Zoom on the usual third Monday at 7.30 p.m. The meetings are public and any resident can attend. Joining details for Zoom are published with the agenda on the website stfaithspc.norfolkparishes.gov.uk or can be obtained from the Clerk 898621 stfaithpc@gmail.com

At a recent meeting Rodney Cushing stood down as Chairman and Ray Browne was elected in his place.

The Parish Council has placed an order to convert all their streetlights to modern LED lanterns at a cost of £16,665. This will reduce electricity and maintenance charges considerably. This project is being funded by Community Infrastructure Levy monies received from the Lovell development off Manor Road.

Problems have been found with the surface lifting on the cemetery drive in Blind Lane. Discussions have been held with the installing contractor and these issues have yet to be resolved.

The Council were consulted on a proposed Solar Farm in Hainford and tabled an objection to the proposed traffic construction route which was from the A140 via Church Street, Crown Road and Spixworth Road.

At the time of writing New Holme Lane cycleway is closed to facilitate road construction off the A140 to serve the new recycling centre. The Council have asked NCC to try and find a safe option at the Cromer Road end so that this rout can be re-opened as an important link between St.Faiths, Norwich and elsewhere.

I am hopeful that by the time you receive this that we will be easing out of lockdown, once again. I hope that you have managed to keep well and have made the most of some quiet time at home.

What a year this has been! Invariably, as we approach the end of any year we take a look back at the things we've done, the people we've met, the places we've been and so on. I suspect that this year many of our memories will be of time spent at home, in the garden, out walking etc, with the vast majority of our conversations made over the telephone, or across the internet via things such as Zoom, Skype or Facetime. In many ways we have been on a steep learning curve as we have had to grapple with new technology simply to communicate beyond our homes. I do wonder what things might have been like without such technology this year. I guess that many more folks would have felt even more isolated and alone than was the case.

It has both surprised and frustrated me to hear, on several occasions, that Christmas has been cancelled this year. Of course, it hasn't, although the way we celebrate the season will be very different from our normal festivities. Everything has had to be scaled down, risk assessment forms have had to be filled in and complied with, family gatherings must be limited, and even our church services will be different. Attendance must be pre-booked to ensure maximum, safe capacity, carols won't be sung, to avoid spreading the virus, the church will be cleaned and sanitised between services and so on and so on.

However, there is one thing that hasn't changed, and that is what we are celebrating – The Birth of Jesus Christ.

All those years ago, God sent his Son into our world to bring peace, joy and love. Mary was chosen to be his earthly mother, and Joseph was tasked with being his father. They weren't rich, Joseph was a carpenter and worked hard for a living. Mary was a young teenaged girl. Due to the law of the day Joseph took Mary to Bethlehem, miles from their home in Nazareth, in order to register in his ancestral town for the national census. Bethlehem being a large City was crowded with families who had also come to register, and so it was that there was nowhere for them to stay other than a dirty, smelly stable at the back of an inn. It was there that Jesus, the Son of God, was born.

Although the people of that time were waiting and longing for the Messiah this was not what they were expecting. Only a very few people recognised him from the beginning; the shepherds, who were informed by the heavenly choir of angels, the wise men, who followed the star for hundreds of miles over probably a couple of years to meet him, Mary, Joseph and, when Jesus was taken to the Temple, Simeon and Anna.

Over the two millennia since that time many trillions of others have come to recognise Jesus and have followed his teaching of love and forgiveness. What we celebrate this Christmas is that. Jesus is still here among us in our homes and in our daily lives, and he still wants us to follow his example of love and forgiveness in our hurting, fragile world.


Whatever the size of our gathering, or the number of cards we receive or send, let's make this Christmas extra special in a new way and remember the reason for the season.

FINANCIAL HELP AVAILABLE

The St. Faiths Fuel Allotments Charity was established to help residents of the parish who are suffering financial hardship.

If you are the head of a household or individual resident in Horsham or Newton St. Faith who is in real need of financial support, especially if resulting from the pandemic, you may be eligible to receive assistance. Grants are not restricted to the elderly or any other particular group.

The Trustees are about to allocate grant expenditure for the coming year and invite applications for financial assistance. If you need financial help to tide you over a difficult time of need and feel that you may qualify do please apply. People employed in full or part-time work are not normally eligible.

Grants would be made on the basis of an honest statement of your personal critical situation and financial position. Details supplied on the application form should include your name, age, address, telephone number, ages of dependants living in the household with you and details of any benefits or grants already received, if any. A genuine need must be evident to qualify for grants which are normally paid in Spring and Autumn each year.

Every application will be treated with the utmost sensitivity and information you need to provide will, of course, remain completely confidential. Application forms for aid may be obtained from and returned to the Secretary to the Trustees: Mr. Tony Howes, "Lamorna", 55 Coltishall Lane, Horsham St. Faith, NR10 3HU (01603 897326) up to 31st January.



My last report in March announced that the Leagues were stopped owing to lock-down. Neither I nor the Team players have been able to play since, although limited practice sessions are beginning to happen. So far so good. but who knows what may happen tomorrow or next week.

I recently received our Norwich League strategy for the 2020/2021 season, if it is able to go forward.

I believe that the Dereham League and others are following the same policy "Table Tennis England have defined a five stage process that should be followed to return to a position where league play and spectating can take place.

As we(Norwich League move towards August many of you will be wondering if the league will start as is currently planned in September. Thank you to all of you who have provided us information regarding your teams and venues through the Part 2 forms and the Team and Venue Initial Risk Assessments. Summarising the information you sent us and also taking into account Government, Sport England and Table Tennis England guidance it is clear that:

- Some of the venues in our league will not be available for use in September
- The detailed guidance for both venues, leagues and players is still evolving and changing
- Clubs and venues will need time to develop and implement their own procedures which follow this guidance
- Some of our players are still not confident that it is yet safe to return to the table even to practice let alone to play competitive league games.

Taking all of the above into account, we have therefore made the decision that we will NOT be starting the NDTTL 2020-2021 season in September 2020 and our earliest PLANNED start date for league play is now January 2021."

So, I fear I have little to report for this journal. The Centre had been booked for our Norwich AGM in May, but of course that event was cancelled, together with our Presentation Night for silverware and awards. This is always a good social evening to meet up with old adversaries !

A "virtual" AGM was conducted in May, although I did not join in on "zoom", which I decided was a step too far. Little could be decided for the next season, and we need to wait and see how things progress towards an anticipated re-start next January.

I will keep you posted as the journals are resumed, and hope you are all coping as well as possible.

NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IN NEWTON ST FAITH

CROWN MEADOWS

It was interesting to read in last month's Journal how the naming of roads at the above development came about

However, the actual location of the suggested Mill is very questionable

The first Ordnance Survey Map of 1838 shows only two Mills in St Faith's a Water Corn Mill in Mill Lane and what was called a Smockmill next to what was the Union Workhouse (now the Crematorium) This Mill was owned in the early 1800s by Stephen Ewing

In the Norfolk Chronicle July 1849 Stephen Ewing is recorded that this Mill together with his dwelling house, Grocers Shop and baking facilities is up for sale and again in the Norfolk Chronicle in July 1953 (one assumes the first sale attempt failed)

It ended up being purchased by a Mr R Eglington who later died in August 1866 when a sale took place at the Black Swan in November of that year. The Mill was then acquired by William Buckenham

No evidence has yet been discovered of any historic Mill behind what was the Crown Public House now Crown Garage

Unless of course you know different!
