Church accident repairs

Have been now completed. The next step forward is to build the outside porch and accommodate the repaired section of the church to move there from the hall so that we can continue with our church building development without interfering sometime in the near future. The name of the builder chosen to do the work is FIJ Building Contractors, of Ashburton, and the Pre start meeting was on Thursday 8th October to start on Monday 19th October. It will take approx. ten weeks to finish.

Sunday Mass

- To help create a quiet and prayerful atmosphere once inside the church before Services.
- To have easier access to open windows, water plants and light candles in window sills.
- To welcome people before they enter the church.
- To expand the space available for umbrellas, notice board and display of newspapers, magazines, newsletters and other publications.
- To keep the Clergy under cover when they dismiss the congregation as they go out after Mass and other Services.
