Church building development progress Phase 1

Week 1: The FIJ Building Contractors of Ashburton have set up site and have demolished the existing half brick walls by the door, excavated the existing strip foundation, cut tarmac for drainage runs to soak away.

Week 2: They have excavated new foundation and concrete, laid new drainage, inserted manholes and back filled, and installed new strip foundations.

Week 3: They have reinforced the area that was sinking in the car park to avoid further damage in the future, started building the porch, removed the carpet tiles in the aisle and fixed the skirting board to the walls to prepare it for painting.

Week 4: No one has been on site for four day. The builders have been sourcing materials and manufacturing joinery for the next step ahead.

They hope to finish, if everything goes well, the week before Christmas.
