What are we to expect from St Anthony's development work Phase 2?

Bigger inside church area, better ventilation, new and efficient heating installation, improved insulation, an asbestos free building, an eye friendly and practical lighting system in church, house and car park, a new church wing opposite and similar to the one we have, a sanctuary to be right in the centre at the end of the main aisle, a small wooden canopy above the Priest's chair, an elevation with two skylights above the sanctuary to improve light and ventilation, a Reconciliation room (confessional), a much larger sacristy, access doors to the house in either side behind the sanctuary, an entrance hall leading to the church/the main hall/the sacristy/upstairs/the car park, a straight staircase leading from the entrance hall to the upstairs landing, a chair lift, an upstairs toilet with wash hand basin and wet shower room, much improved storage space in different locations, relocation of office door, carpet/linoleum floors in sacristy, entrance hall, main hall, church, upstairs rooms, kitchen, toilet and car park entrance to the main hall, upgrading of main toilet to comply with new regulations, rerouting the drainage pipes in the internal yard to go through the main hall to the car park to avoid going through the church into the car park, an extension of the bay window to keep in line with the main entrance to the house, projection facilities in main hall, painting of all walls, doors and woodwork, painting the outside of the house, a protective low concrete and brick wall by the pavement to avoid another car accident impact. In short, we should have an upgraded, safer and more welcoming building for our deserving worshipping Community of St Anthony's and visitors!
