Dear Seniors and Parents:

The following packet contains information and instructions to apply for local scholarships for the Class of 2021. These scholarships are offered to Lindenhurst High School seniors only, so we highly encourage all students to consider applying. Please read all instructions **CAREFULLY** before completing the application. All directions must be followed **EXACTLY** or the application will not be considered.

Read the criteria for each scholarship listed and apply for those scholarships for which you feel qualified. All applications **must be typed! No hand written applications will be accepted.** Students may download an application from any computer by clicking on the local scholarship link at www.lindenhurstschools.org. Once downloaded, students can fill out the application directly online and then print out a typed copy.

Please be sure to include any additional information requested by each specific scholarship. Students may be asked to include a second essay, financial information, verification of community service, letters of recommendation or a high school transcript. The Guidance Office will complete your rank in class and your cumulative average, as well as provide any recommendations or official transcripts that are requested by sponsors. Please **FLAG** (with a post-it) any application needing copies of letters of recommendation and transcripts. Make certain that your letters of recommendation are on file, and be specific regarding whose letters you wish to include. It is also **EXTREMELY** important to complete the Honor Pledge in order to release your application to scholarship sponsors.

In the event that you are fortunate enough to receive one of the scholarships, please make sure you thank your benefactor **in writing**.

Please return your completed scholarship packets to the Guidance Office no later than **March 1, 2021**. All students will have four weeks to complete this process, so there will be no exceptions made if packets are late!

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DIRECTIONS FOR THE LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

PLEASE FOLLOW ALL DIRECTIONS EXACTLY
OR YOUR APPLICATION WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED!

1. All application information and essays must be **TYPED!** No hand written applications will be accepted. Students can download an application from any computer by clicking on the local scholarship link at www.lindenhurstschools.org. Once downloaded, students can fill out the application directly online and then print out a typed copy. Any student may use a computer in one of our computer labs at school, if needed. The labs are located in Rooms 205 and 208, but are subject to availability. Students using school facilities are permitted to print one copy only of the scholarship application and each essay! Duplicate copies of this information must be photocopied by the student. Students are also advised to complete a cover page for each scholarship as well.
2. Students must create **SEPARATE APPLICATION PACKETS** for each scholarship they are applying for. All packets must include a **COVER PAGE** which clearly states the name of the scholarship and ID # (**no names please**), an **APPLICATION** (pages 4, 5, & 6) and the student's **PERSONAL ESSAY**. Only include an additional essay, recommendations, the Financial Information Form, and/or transcript if the specific scholarship specifies one or all of these documents. **ONLY ONE HONOR PLEDGE IS REQUIRED!** NO FOLDERS PLEASE! (Please see the following page for a sample layout of the application packets!)
3. Signatures of the student and parent/guardian are **REQUIRED** and must be signed in **DARK INK** on Page 3 (the Honor Pledge) of the application. **DO NOT duplicate this page!** Only one copy is necessary!
4. All scholarships for which the student will be applying to must be listed alphabetically on Page 3 beneath the Honor Pledge.
5. The application must be completed using the space available.
6. Students must identify themselves by student ID# only. This number must be included on the upper right hand corner of all essay pages and on the cover page.
7. Each student is required to provide a personal statement or essay about him or herself. This may include information about future plans, goals or any additional information that may be helpful to the committee in evaluating the student as a candidate. The document must be double spaced, at least one page in length, but no more than two pages, and written by the candidate. The document must also be duplicated for every scholarship for which the student is applying.
8. If a scholarship sponsor requests a second essay from the student, please include that essay in the scholarship packet for that scholarship **ONLY!**
9. The Financial Information Form (Page 7) should only be included in those scholarship packets which specifically request the form.
10. If a transcript or letter of recommendation is requested by a scholarship sponsor, please let guidance know by flagging the specific scholarship packet with a post-it specifying whose letter you would like to include. If a student does not have a letter of recommendation on file in guidance, please obtain one and duplicate it for each scholarship requiring a letter.
11. Each student must submit all application packets at the same time. The Honor Pledge on Page 3, must be provided only once on top of an alphabetized pile of scholarship application packets. The Honor Pledge will be retained by the guidance office.
12. In the event that you are fortunate enough to receive one of the scholarships, please make sure you thank your benefactor in writing.

ALBANY AVENUE MARTHA KAMINSKI SCHOLARSHIP

One (1) \$500 award in memory of Martha Kaminski. Candidate **must be a graduate of Albany Ave. Elementary School**, have an 80% or better average and plan to continue his/her education. ***A letter stating the student's goals for the future and career aim is required as is one letter of recommendation and a transcript.***

ALBANY AVE. PTA SCHOLARSHIP

One (1) \$500 scholarship. Candidate **must be a graduate of Albany Ave. Elementary School**, have an 80% or better average and plan to continue his/her education. ***A letter stating the student's goals for the future and career aim is required as is one letter of recommendation and a transcript.***

ALLEGHANY AVENUE SCHOOL

(Please specify Jack O'Shaughnessy or Alumni.)

ALLEGHANY AVE. JACK O'SHAUGHNESSY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$500 scholarship. **Must have graduated from Alleghany Avenue School, Lindenhurst Middle School and will graduate from Lindenhurst High School.** Grade point average must be 85 or above, must demonstrate academic and extracurricular achievement, and plan to continue education. ***Transcript, SAT scores and two (2) letters of recommendation from high school teachers are required. An essay must accompany application, "If I had the power to change one thing in the world ..."***

ALLEGHANY AVE. ALUMNI AWARD

\$500 scholarship. **Must have graduated from Alleghany Ave. School, Lindenhurst Middle School and will graduate from Lindenhurst High School.** No minimum grade point average required. Must demonstrate volunteerism in school, community, etc. and plan to continue education. ***Two (2) letters of recommendation from high school teachers are required. An essay must accompany application, "What contributions do you believe you have made to your community?"***

BABYLON LIONS CLUB COMMUNITY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who **demonstrates both academic achievement and a record of outstanding community service.** You must be planning to attend a two- or four-year accredited post-secondary institution. Because Lions Clubs around the world are service oriented, community service will be a major factor in determining the recipient of this award. ***Please include your resume showing all after-school/extra-curricular activities and service to school and/or community. A 150-word essay describing how you have demonstrated a commitment to community service is also required.***

BE THE GOOD IN THE WORLD SCHOLARSHIP

At Restoration Kitchen and Cocktails, **our mantra is to "Be the Good"**. We believe in paying it forward, doing right by others and helping those in need. We are looking to award two (2) scholarships to one male and one female Lindenhurst High School **student who embodies this mantra.** Applicants must have a GPA of 85% or higher and show proof of acceptance into either a two year or four year institution for the Fall 2021 semester. ***A one page essay portraying how you are helping to "Be the Good" in the Lindenhurst community must be submitted with your application.***

CHRISTINA ROSE RENNA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Christina Rose Renna understood the challenges of achieving success, pursuing knowledge, and mastering the art of learning in the face of overwhelming adversity and daunting obstacles. Her will to endure, serves as the model for all young students who wish to grow to meet their full potential. Her drive and spirit touched all who were fortunate enough to know her. In her memory, the Christina Renna Foundation offers two (2) scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. Applicants must have: an average of 85% or better, an acceptance letter to a two or four-year college, a list of extra-curricular activities, and a body of work in community service. ***A transcript and a one-page essay dealing with the topic “The Effects of Children’s Cancer on One’s Family”, must accompany the application.***

CHRISTOPHER VERSACE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded. Applicants must have attended Lindenhurst High School for four (4) years. Must have maintained an 80% average or above, have exemplary character and shown service to the community and school through participation in both community and school activities. ***An essay must accompany the application: “What has inspired you to volunteer and participate in both community and school activities?”***

CLASS OF 2000 – FRANK CUSH JR. AWARD

\$100 awarded to a student **who has displayed exemplary character, school spirit and shown service to school and community through participation in clubs, class events, Student Council or other activities.** Student must have also attended Lindenhurst High School for four (4) years, maintained at least an 80% cumulative average and plan to attend a 2 or 4-year accredited college or university. Additional Requirements are: ***recommendation from a school advisor, community member or current employer and an essay on “What Lindy means to me and why?”***

CSEA AIDES UNIT SCHOLARSHIP

Two (2) scholarships in the amount of \$750 each will be awarded to students **whose parent or grandparent is currently working as an aide in the Lindenhurst School District.** Please specify the relationship. ***An essay on “What did you do during your high school years that showed community support and service? What do you plan on doing to continue that service once you have graduated?” is required.***

BOBBY BRANDENBERGER CSEA BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

One (1) scholarship in the amount of \$250 will be awarded to a Lindenhurst Senior High School senior who plans to continue their education in the field of technology at a 2 or 4-year college or vocational training school.

DANIEL STREET SCHOOL

(Please specify Daniel PTA, Sandy Steinis OR Isabella Pine Scholarship)

DANIEL STREET PTA SCHOLARSHIPS

Two (2) scholarships of \$500 awarded to students who have **graduated from Daniel Street Elementary School**. Must have 80% or better average and been accepted to a 2 or 4-year college, vocational or trade school. ***Student must write an essay titled: Why Daniel Street School is so special to me.***

DANIEL STREET - SANDY STEINIS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$500 will be awarded to a graduating student who has **attended Daniel Street Elementary School**. Student must have an average of 80% or better and be continuing their education. ***Student must write an essay about his or her volunteering and/or community service.***

DANIEL STREET - ISABELLA PINE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$500 will be awarded to a **graduating student who has attended Daniel Street Elementary School and is pursuing a career in the medical field**. Student must have an average of 80% or better and be continuing their education. ***Student must write an essay about his or her interest/reason for pursuing a career in the medical field.***

DEBRA CZAWURSKY “KINDNESS COUNTS” MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A one-time, \$250 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating Lindenhurst High School senior who is planning to continue their education. A short statement about a recent act of kindness is required.

GERALDINE CUNEO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (TAL)

\$1,000 will be awarded to a student **who intends to pursue a career in MUSIC and/or ELEMENTARY EDUCATION**. Must have a minimum 3 1/2 year average of 85%. ***Additional essay relating what inspired you to become a teacher and what you would like to teach and why, is required. A transcript is also required.***

GERRI CHIMENTI MEMORIAL ART SCHOLARSHIP sponsored by NAHS

Gerri Chimenti was a self-taught artist. Painting was her hobby which later became her permanent desire. Her love and passion for Art inspired her daughter to become an Art teacher and her grandsons to love it as well. In her memory, this scholarship will be **awarded to a Lindenhurst Senior with the same love and desire for Art** (i.e. Fine Arts, Media, Drama and/or Architecture). Students must be an example of good citizenship and be involved in community service. ***An essay describing how Art has influenced you is required, as well as a resume and/or portfolio of your work, along with an acceptance letter to a two-or four-year college for an Art related field.*** Post requirement is a thank you letter to all of the organizations that contributed to the scholarship, along with updates on the student's progress in college.

GILA GEVINT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Two (2) \$100 awards in memory of Gila Gevint, a former Assistant Principal at Lindenhurst High School. Award recipients must **be National Honor Society probates or members**, have an average of 90% or better, and exemplify the four tenets of the National Honor Society - Character, Leadership, Scholarship, Service. ***An additional essay is required - Which of the four National Honor Society characteristics (Character, Leadership, Scholarship, Service) means the most to you and why?***

HARDING AVE. SCHOOL

(Please specify Walter A. Ohnmacht or Richard Price Memorial Scholarship)

WALTER A. OHNMACHT - HARDING AVENUE PTA SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

\$500 award to a Lindenhurst High School graduating senior and **former Harding Avenue Elementary School student**, promoted from the fifth grade, who has been accepted to college. The student must have an average of at least 85% and show good character and citizenship. **A 200-word or less essay, "What did your experience(s) at Harding Avenue Elementary mean to you?" is also required.**

RICHARD PRICE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

One (1) \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating Lindenhurst High School senior and **former Harding Avenue Elementary School student**. The student must have a weighted grade point average of 85 or above. **The student must write an essay, of no more than 200 words, on how they have shown good character, leadership and responsibility throughout their educational career.** Candidates should include any activities they participated in within the community/school and must be accepted to a 2 or 4 year college.

HEMSTOCK FUNDRAISER—IN MEMORY OF FALLEN NEW YORK SERGEANT PAUL TUOZZOLO SCHOLARSHIP

A one-time, \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating Lindenhurst High school senior who is a Junior Volunteer Firefighter, ROTC participant, Eagle Scout or Gold Star Girl Scout **OR** who has a family member in the Civil Service field (Police Officer, Firefighter, EMT, employed by the Military). **Please specify the criteria you meet for eligibility.**

JENNIFER BEYRER DELUTIO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A one-time, \$1,000 scholarship in memory of Jennifer Beyrer deLutio, a 1991 graduate of Lindenhurst High School, will be awarded to a Lindenhurst High School senior with **high academic achievement, outstanding school spirit, and community involvement** who will be continuing their education in the fall.

JENNIFER CACCIOLA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A \$250 scholarship in memory of Jennifer Cacciola – Class of 2002 will be awarded. Students must have maintained an 80% average or higher and plan to continue their education. **An essay on what High School graduation means to me must accompany application.**

JOHN CANESTRARO AWARD

Award of \$1,000 (\$250 a year for four (4) consecutive years upon receipt of transcript) to a **LINDENHURST HIGH SCHOOL MUSIC student with the following qualifications:** Student must be an active participant in the Lindenhurst High School's band, orchestra or choral programs with a "music" average of 90 or higher. Student should be an example of good citizenship with an obvious regard for school, community, faculty, administration and other students. **Student should be planning to pursue a career in a music related field** (i.e. performance, music education, music therapy, etc.) **Must have performed NYSSMA solo with a difficulty level of 6 and received a score of 90 or higher.** Student should display a positive attitude towards education and possess an academic average of 85 or higher. **An essay describing how music has affected your life and how you plan to use music in your career is required.**

JOHN MARSDEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

One (1) \$250 Scholarship

John Marsden was a Lindenhurst High School graduate who attended Bower Elementary School and played as a Lindenhurst Bulldog on the football team. John dedicated each day to loving his fiancée, Lisa Sandoval, who is also a Lindenhurst High School graduate and is a current elementary school teacher at Alleghany. He also enjoyed spending time with his stepson, Thomas. John was caring and always thought of others before himself. He loved fitness, traveling, and spending time at the beach. This scholarship acknowledges his love of life, family, and friends. ***Applicants must be active members of the community who demonstrate thoughtful, caring and selfless acts of service to others and plan to continue their education.***

KAREN L. McNULTY SCHOLARSHIP

Karen McNulty was a lifelong caregiver, nurse, mother, and grandmother. She dedicated her life to caring for others and advocating for care and resources for her extended family and those all around her in the greater Lindenhurst community. In order to help keep her spirit alive for years to come, her family has created this scholarship program to address the two areas of her dedication that she loved so dearly. There will be **two (2)** awards. Please indicate the scholarship(s) you are applying for.

Scholarship #1: A \$200 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who **plans to pursue a career in nursing. A short essay about an experience in school and/or in the community that has led to an interest in pursuing a career in nursing is required. A transcript and financial information form is required.**

Scholarship #2: A \$200 scholarship will be awarded to a **graduating senior that has had a life-threatening illness or condition. A short essay on how the experience has impacted your career path and focus for the future is required. A transcript and financial information form is required.**

KATHERINE GENTNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

One (1) \$750 scholarship awarded to a graduating senior planning to attend a 2 or 4-year college **to pursue a career in a STEM field (Science, Technology, Engineering or Math).** Student must have a weighted grade point average of 80 or above. ***A statement of no more than 200 words on your career goals is required. Participation in diverse activities within the community and school is required.***

KIWANIS CLUB OF LINDENHURST

(Please specify The Tony Lazio Memorial Scholarship, the Wm. Juback and Richard Heuwetter Memorial Key Club Scholarship or the Nives Hoffmann Lozito Memorial Scholarship)

KIWANIS CLUB OF LINDENHURST –THE TONY LAZIO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

TWO (2) SCHOLARSHIPS WILL BE AWARDED. Two (2) \$2,000 scholarships, payable \$500 for the first year and each of the next three years. Applicant must have a three year average of 75% or better. Additional essay on what college costs you expect to incur and where you expect to get the funds required. A transcript, SAT scores, and the financial information form are also required. Interview with the Scholarship Committee is **REQUIRED:** in April 2021, starting at 2:00 p.m. at the high school. Applicants will be advised by the school if they have advanced to the interview level.
