- 2. The committee will not accept any responsibility for any damage, injury or loss by any means to persons or their property.
- 3. Entry fees must accompany all entries (exhibits entered in more than one class must be accompanied by the appropriate entry fees for each class).
- 4. Should any dispute whatsoever arise, the decision of the committee or any umpire appointed by them shall be final.
- 5. Any objection or protest must be made in writing to the secretary with a deposit of  $\pounds 10$  by 3.00 pm, or within 30 minutes of the event complained of (whichever is the later). If the objection is upheld the deposit will be refunded.
- 6. All exhibits must be displayed and all livestock on the field by 10.30am.

(Produce/Handicrafts to be displayed between 9am & 10.30am must be collected between 4 pm & 5 pm. Any exhibits not collected by 5.30pm will not be available after this time).
